

DOJ watchdog report sheds light on love lives of 2 more anti-Trump FBI employees (and their emoticons)

The Justice Department watchdog's bombshell report on the FBI's actions in the Hillary Clinton email investigation shed light on anti-Trump texts from two FBI employees, beyond bureau lovebirds Peter Strzok and Lisa Page.

Page worked under the leadership of former FBI Director James Comey, and into Clinton's use of a private server for government business while she was secretary of state during the Obama administration.
